Secure and expand substantial new federal funding for Recovery Support Services

- Increase funding for the Building Communities of Recovery (BCOR) grant program from \$5 million to \$20 million.
- Increase funding levels for SAMHSA's Targeted Capacity Expansion Peer to Peer (TCE-P2P) and the Recovery Community Services Program Statewide Network (RCSP-SN) grant programs.
- Provide funding for recovery housing, recovery high schools, collegiate recovery programs and alternative peer groups.
- Provide funding for school and community-based recovery programs to support children and families impacted by addiction.
- Expand and enhance funding for pre- and post-release Recovery Support Services for individuals, and their children and families, when returning to communities from incarceration.
- Increase the Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment (SAPT) Block Grant by \$500 million.
- Enact legislation that requires 20% of the Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment (SAPT) Block Grant be dedicated to funding Recovery Support Services.
- Ensure \$1 million is appropriated for a national peer-run training and technical assistance center as authorized in the SUPPORT Act of 2018
- Protect patient privacy rights by maintaining and enforcing the federal confidentiality law 42 USC290DD
- **3** Enforce the Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act of 2008
- Restore voting rights for individuals with felony drug convictions.
- Support federal and state policy reform efforts to eliminate discriminatory policies and practices that create barriers to employment, housing, education, health care and civic engagement.

Investing in recovery support services will reap the economic benefits of long-term recovery, reduce the burden on the criminal justice and child welfare systems, and get people the housing, employment and educational services they need.
